IVAN SERPA

Born in Rio, 1923. Studied with Alex Loskohek. First exhibit, at the National Salon of Fine Arts, 1947; first individual exhibit at the Brazil-United States Institute, 1951; participated in the following Sao Paulo Biennials: the I, 1951, where he won the "Young National Painter" Award; the III, 1955, where he won a prize; the IV, 1957, where he won the "Moinho Santista" Prize; the IV, 1957, where he won the "Rio de Janeiro Museum of Modern Art" prize; and the VII, 1963. Participated in the 1952 and 1955 Biennials of Venice, Italy, and in the XXXI.

Participated in the I National Exhibit of Abstract Arts, 1953; held an individual exhibit in Washington, D.C., 1950. Held an individual exhibit at the Museum of Modern Art in Rio, 1961, and participated in a collective exhibit of the "Forward Group" at the same Museum, 1961. Exhibited at the III Hispano - American Art Biennial, Barcelona, Spain. Won the "Foreign Tour" prize ( a trip to Europe ) at the VI National Salon of Modern Art in Rio, 1961. Held an individual exhibit at the Barcinsky Gallery, in Rio, 1963.
