Progress Report for Spring from April to May 19 86
Iole arrived in New York City on April 1 and has begun her internship at the Museum of Modern Art in Manhattan (New York City). According to Elizabeth Streibert, Associate Director for International Programs at the MOMA, Iole has been assigned to the Office of the Registrar and will be working with the daily activites directly related to temporary exhibitions as well as the permanent collection. She will participate in cataloguing, which, although not directly related to her field, will be useful for her overall knowledge of and experience in a museum like the MOMA. She will have contact with the Exhibition Design Department at the MOMA and at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. I have spoken with Iole on several occaisons. In our last conversation she indicated the need to travel to other museums, perhaps in Boston and in Washington D.C., in order to experience how other museums of this size and scope handle their exhibits. Her trip, at this time, is still in the planning stages.
In addition to the above, Iole will be conducting research for a Contemporary Sculpture Exhibition to be held at FUNARTE in October 1986.
A project is being prepared on texts and photo documentation of registration methods at the MOMA. A basic text will accompany this work, in Portuguese, and possibly printed in Brazil upon her return.
