There is an old saying in Italy: "Beauty is the thing in women, like speed in ships." And never did anyone personify this more than Linda. She is 5' 6" and measures 38-24-37, and, yet, in talking to her there is the impression of physical delicacy and refinement. Quite without conscious effort, her mind constantly turns to the stage, including the operatic. She prefers Vienna to Milan, musically, leans toward the Rhenish rather than the bravura mood. Linda is undeterred, however; perhaps because she will be near her native hills of Bolzano in Northern Italy. There is something of Bolzano's specialized charm in Linda herself.
